

Declaration by Ferrari electronic AG on the EC Directive 2011/65/EC (RoHS 2) of January 3rd, 2013 and its implementation into national law through the Elektro- und Elektronikgeräte-Stoff-Verordnung in the version of April 19th, 2013

With the adoption of the EC Directives 2002/95/EC and 2011/65/EC, the European Union has restricted the use of certain dangerous substances in electrical and electronic equipment throughout Europe. This regulation was introduced in Germany by the "Law on the placing on the market, taking back and environmentally friendly disposal of electrical and electronic equipment" (ElektroG), which came into force on March 16th, 2005, and on April 19th, 2013 by the Elektro- und Elektronikgeräte-Stoff-Verordnung (Electrical and Electronic Equipment Substance -Regulation). This directive is collectively called RoHS II (Restriction of the use of certain hazardous substances).

RoHS imposes restrictions on the use of certain hazardous substances (heavy metals such as lead, cadmium, mercury, polybrominated biphenyls (PBB), polybrominated diphenyl ethers (PBDE) and chromium VI compounds) for devices that were brought into circulation for the first time on or after July 1st, 2006. The aim is to avoid environmental and health impacts from the outset and to prevent disposal problems from arising in the first place.

Since July 22nd, 2019, four additional substance groups (the plasticizers DEHP, BBP, DBP and DINP) have been restricted with maximum concentrations by EC Directive 2025/863.

Ferrari electronic welcomes these regulations in the spirit of future-oriented and sustainable industrial production. We confirm that our products comply with the RoHS II specifications.
